

Scrappily Ever After: By Deb Heatherly

This class will teach students to use the Creative Grids®:

- CGRJAW3-Pineapple Trim tool (In a new and unique technique)
- CGRDH4- Ultimate Flying Geese Tool

Students may purchase the required tools from their local quilt shop or from my web site www.debscatsnquilts.com before the class. I will also have 3 of each tool with me to share in class but having your own will keep you from having to wait.



Students may purchase the pattern from their local quilt shop or, from my web site www.debscatsnquilts.com before class. Students may also purchase the pattern from instructor the day of class. If purchasing the pattern, the day of class, please have cash or check made out to Deb's Cats n Quilts Designs. Pattern \$10.

In addition to the tools listed above, please bring to class:

Sewing machine with power cord and foot control

Thread and bobbin

Rotary cutter with fresh blade

Small cutting mat

Straight pins, scissors, seam ripper, and anything else you normally use to sew

Small basic ruler such as a 6" x 12"

Mechanical pencil

Iron and small ironing surface

Best Press, Magic Sizing, or whatever you prefer to use when pressing

*Extension cord and power strip unless provided by venue.

Our goal in this class is to:

- To understand how to use each of the featured Creative Grids® tools for the techniques in this quilt.
- To complete at least (1) Pineapple Pinwheel Block and (8) geese to border the block.
- To learn how to make the pieced border units using the pineapple pinwheel technique.

Deb will demonstrate 3 ways to make the flying geese.

Please see yardage information on the next page. Because you will decide which geese method you prefer once you try them in class, cutting listed is only for a few flying geese units.

Please pre-cut before class and place individual cuts in a zip loc labeled with size and any other pertinent information so that you can easily find the pieces you need in class.

This pattern is designed to use up scraps! **What kind of scraps?** *Big or small you can use them all!*

Not a scrappy person? Using a fat quarter bundle will give you a scrappy look within a coordinated fabric line.

Yardage for the quilt:

Lap 54" x 54"

- Light background 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ yd.
- Scraps to equal 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ yd.
- Sashing and first border $\frac{1}{2}$ yd.
- Outer border $\frac{5}{8}$ yd.
- Binding $\frac{5}{8}$ yd.

Quilt 79" x 79"

- Light background 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ yd.
- Scraps to equal approx. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ yd.
- Sashing and first border 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yd.
- Outer border 1 yd.
- Binding $\frac{3}{4}$ yd.

For class please cut the following:

Cutting for Pineapple Pinwheels blocks.

- Light Background: Cut (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and (8) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- Scraps using a variety of colors: Cut (8) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, (8) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, (8) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" rectangles, and (8) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 7" rectangles.

Cutting below for Geese is just so that you can try the different methods in class and then decide which method you prefer to use for the rest of the quilt.

No matter which size quilt you are making just cut the following for making geese in class.

- Cut (2) 9" squares of the same color and (2) 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares background for method 1.
- Cut (8) 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares of the same color and (2) 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ " square of background for method 2.
- Repeat cut (8) 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares of the same color and (2) 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ " square of background for method 3.
