



# Strange Bedfellows: Fabric Savvy Playshop with Diane Harris

## Supply list

This class is all about discovering the secrets to using wildly incongruous fabrics together for amazing and beautiful results. It's playtime—so it's fun!

A regular glue stick

1 fat quarter of a fabric you love

1 fat quarter of a fabric you strongly dislike

A portable design board around 24" wide (see below)

Before class, cut both fat quarters into 20 squares 3½" x 3½".

If you don't have a portable design board, please make one (instructions follow) and bring it with you to class. Use a piece of foam-core board from the craft store, cut it to about 24" x 24" and cover it with cotton or cotton/wool batting. To do so, cut the batting 4" or 5" larger than your board. Wrap the batting around to the back of the board and secure it with painter's tape or duct tape. Be sure that fabric patches will stick to the batting you use. It's fine if your design board is larger but it shouldn't be smaller than 24" x 24". If you have another type of design board/wall, you may bring that instead as long as it's big enough.
