



409 - Stripes Yipes! With Heather Kojan

Janome sewing machines provided by “Seams Sew Perfect”

During class, we'll make blocks of hexagons and squares.

Multi-colored stripes with varying widths work best. Blocks made from each sample can be made into a baby-sized quilt. If you plan to make a larger size, more fabric will be required.

For each, you'll need 1 ½ yards striped fabric. Fabric to complete each baby sized quilt are below.

Hexagon Quilt (approximately 31” x 36”)

1 ½ yards striped fabric

¾ yard for setting triangles and borders (not suited for directional fabric)

⅓ yard binding fabric

1 ¼ yard backing fabric

Batting, at least 40” x 44”

Square Quilt (approximately 40” x 40”)

1 ½ yards striped fabric

½ yard border fabric

⅓ yard binding fabric

1 ¼ yard backing fabric

Batting, at least 44” x 44”

Also needed:

Thread for piecing.

Rotary cutter with new blade and cutting mat. Thread to match fabrics.

24” long ruler and

square 12 ½” ruler or similar sizes.

For the hexagon quilt, a 60 degree, 8 ½” ruler with blunted top point is required.

Usual supplies such as marking tools, pins, seam ripper and anything else you can't live without!
