

Rose Star Quilt Pattern by Marci Baker

Class Description

Get your toes wet with just one block for a center piece or dive right in to create the desired quilt size. Playing with different values and colors, you can create flowers blooming and stars shining with some transparency appearing here and there. Using just one shape, hence the term one-patch, the fun continues with an easy, foolproof method for set-in seams aka y-seams. If you can sew a consistent seam allowance, you can create beautiful and flawless flowers and stars.



Class Length

3-hour class - we will only have time to make one flower in this class. As time allows, we can look at more options for fabric choices.

Class Supply List

Rose Star Quilt Pattern, C&T Publishing, available at class

Sewing Machine and basic tools

Rotary Cutter and Mat

Clearview Triangle ruler, 8", 10", or Super60, available at class

Preparation Before Class

The Rose Star requires 5 fabrics and 1 background.

To make a single block:

Bring 2 Light, 2 Dark, and 4 Medium fabrics and 1 Background fabric.

Since the class is half-day, pre-cut your strips as follows:

Cut (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip of each L, M, and D, or if using fat quarters (2) 2 ½" x 20" strips.
Bring the strip(s) and remaining fabric to class.

Cut (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips of background.

To make a project/quilt, see the yardages on the next page.

Yardages *	Wallhanging	Lap/Throw	Full	Queen	King
Project Size	44 x 46	57 x 67	83 x 90	96 x 97	109 x 112
Number of Blocks	7	18	36	46	60
Flower/Star	20 - 2 1/2" strips or 2 yds	48 - 2 1/2" strips or 4 1/2 yds	96 - 2 1/2" strips or 8 1/2 yds	124 - 2 1/2" strips or 10 yds	160 - 2 1/2" strips or 12 1/2 yds
Background	1 1/8 yds	2 1/4 yds	4 1/4 yds	6 yds	7 1/4 yds

* The yardage may seem excessive, but 1/4 of the area is for seam allowances.
